AMENITIES

TUHEY PARK AND POOL

Tuhey Pool and splash pad is the City of Muncie's only public pool, which is open from Memorial Day to Labor Day every year.

EMERSON DOG PARK

Emerson Dog Park is a free space for dogs of all sizes to play. The dog park is fenced into separate large dog and small dog sections and is open to the public 24 hours a day 7 days a week.

WHITE RIVER GREENWAY

The Greenway follows the course of its namesake river for 5.6 miles and connects to the Cardinal Greenway, which runs for 62 miles.

THE VILLAGE

The Village, a business district along University Avenue sits within the Riverside Normal City neighborhood and is just a few steps from Ball State's campus, includes casual dining, shops, and various other local businesses and is a popular hangout for neighborhood residents and students.

Normal City is incorporated **–** 1903 **–** Riverside City is incorporated **-----** 1915 **-**Kitselman Mansion is built along University Ave **— 1919** Normal City and Riverside City are annexed by the City of Muncie The Indiana State Nomal School, Eastern Division is officially renamed Ball Teachers College & Emerson school is built **- 1934 ---**Tuhey Pool and surrounding recreation space was constructed 1981 -Emerson School is demolished Riverside and Meeks Historic Districts are listed on the National Register of Historic Places - 2009 -Tuhey Pool closed to the public due to safety concerns Tuhey Towers was installed at Tuhey Park and Tuhey Pool reopens with a new bathouse and splash pad **- 2013 --**Emerson Dog Park opens to the public **- 2014 -----**Village Promenade opens
